Smart Goals:

Goal 1 - Reading goal -

S-Students will show 20% growth in ISIP data, by the end of the 2023-2024 school year.

M- We will measure our progress by assessing our first monthly ISIP (Istation's Indicators of Progress) and second, using Istation's on-demand assessments to continuously monitor progress bi-weekly, allowing timely adjustments to instruction based on students' needs. Results will be documented in EdHub to track individual growth and progress using change lines.

A-We will achieve this goal by implementing our district appointed intervention program SIPPS. We will continue this goal by using our 'Walk to' model to keep all groups moving forward with effective communication between educators.

R-This goal is extremely important due to it improving students' achievement in English Language Arts proficiency. In which it will help show students' overall progress in all academic areas.

T-This goal will be met by the end of the 23-24 school year. Data will be analyzed by our Intervention team.

Goal 2 -Improve Student Behavior -

S-Improve student behavior in Positive ways and reduce referrals for student misbehavior in the classroom by 15%, through implementing PBIS (Idaho Tiered Behavior Supports) by the end of the school year 23-24.

M-We will achieve this goal by using our reward system through SOAR'S slips. This encourages students to move levels based upon positive reinforcement through the SOAR'S slips, reaching the final level by the end of the school year of 23-24.

A- We will achieve this goal by implementing the Idaho Tiered Behavior Support program.

R- This goal is relevant because it will encourage positive behavior in class, and lessen the probability of interruption of class instruction.

T- This goal will be achieved by the end of the 23-24 school year. Data is analyzed monthly through our SOAR’S assemblies where students are given their reward for their progress based on the number of SOAR’S slips they were given throughout the month.

Goal 3 - Counselor for our school

S-Improve our students' mental health by implementing the support of a counselor.

M- We will measure this goal by having a counselor in school seeing students at least one day per week.

A- We will achieve this goal by contacting the online therapy company and getting everything in place to start seeing students.

R- This goal is relevant because our students need social, and emotional strategies for improvement of mental health and well being.

T- This goal will be achieved by January 2024.
